## Let's Talk About Race 15-in-15

Hosted by the Center for Diversity, Equity, and Social Justice

Description: Why does it seem so difficult to approach the topic of race? It doesn't have to be! In this session, we will explore practical strategies for building race-consciousness and avoiding color-blindness in the classroom.

**Start by sharing how you identify** (Example: I'm Alberto Ramos. I identify as bi-cultural, Latino, Cuban American, Hispanic, I'm comfortable with Latinx as well. My pronouns are he, him, él, and I also identify as a cisgender male.)

Give others an opportunity to introduce themselves and how they identify (folks can share as little or as much as they'd like.)
