



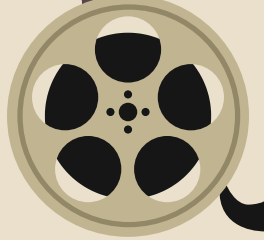
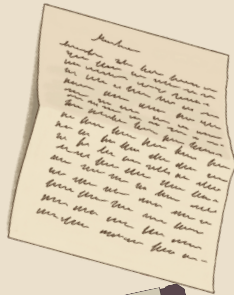

limitations of digital resources

- not everything is digitized
- siloed collections
- varied quality user interfaces
- good sources > perfect sources

how to search

define what you're looking for

- type or format of resource
- who, when?
- where? is there a local collection?

use Google Advanced Search

- limit by domain: .edu, .gov, .org
- titles & exact phrases in " "
- add precision terms
 - keyword(s) + primary sources
 - keyword(s) + digital archives
 - keyword(s) + [resource type]
