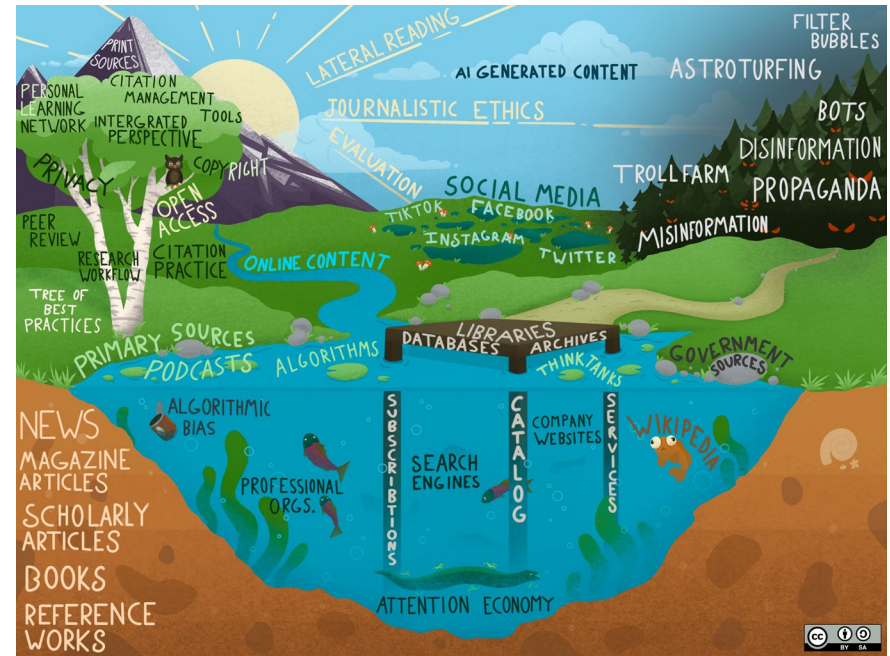
- You want ideas for assignments, activities, or practices to help address the challenges your students have.
